I grew up along the Garden Route, where light does something particular. It filters through coastal fynbos with a softness you don't find elsewhere. But the homes around me rarely matched that beauty. They were practical. Functional. Built to serve, not to inspire.

That disconnect stayed with me.

Ten years into leading CF Architects from our Bryanston studio, I'm still chasing the same thing: homes that feel as considered as the landscapes they inhabit. We work across South Africa, the Garden Route, Cape Town, and recently, further afield—a lakeside retreat in Malawi, a coastal remodel in Spain. But the question remains constant. How do you actually want to live?

Not in theory. In practice.

We've built our approach around three principles. Slow living architecture that creates space for presence rather than perpetual motion. Environmental harmony that dissolves the line between indoors and out. Enduring quality that values craftsmanship over trends, longevity over fashion.

It starts with listening. Really listening. To your rhythms, your rituals, the small moments that define your days. Then we design accordingly. Function first, inspiration second, form third. Materials are honest: timber that shows its grain, stone that bears texture, finishes that age gracefully rather than require constant updating.

After a decade, I've learned this. The best homes don't announce themselves. They simply make your life quieter, calmer, more intentional. You walk through the door and something shifts. That's what we're after.



**Concept Development**





## Design Development

Design Development is where architecture gains resolution. Where broad gestures are tested, refined, and translated into something buildable. This is where good ideas either hold up or reveal their flaws.

We begin by interrogating every decision. Does this window proportion actually work at full scale? Will that ceiling height feel right? How thick should walls be for the thermal performance we're after? These aren't minor details. They're the difference between architecture that looks good on paper and architecture that lives well.

Materials move from inspiration to specification. That rough stone from the moodboard? Now we're selecting the finish and the laying pattern. Timber species are chosen for durability in your climate. Paint colors are visualised against the natural light of your site.

We coordinate with engineers. Structural solutions support your spatial ambitions without compromise. Environmental systems integrate seamlessly. Furniture layouts are finalized. We design knowing exactly where your sofa will sit, how your dining table will be positioned. Joinery is detailed before handing over to specialists.

# Slow Haus

Vision: *Heritage Meets Contemporary: A Melville Sanctuary*

There is a particular kind of magic that happens when a home stops performing and starts living. The Slow Haus, tucked into the leafy edges of Melville, is exactly that kind of place.

On a stand of less than 500 square metres, this heritage home has been transformed into something that feels far bigger than its boundaries suggest. From the street, the heritage facade sits quietly in its neighbourhood. Walk through to the rear and the story changes entirely. What opens up is a layered outdoor world that reads more like a private resort than a city backyard.


The outdoor living area cascades across multiple levels, each designed for a different pace of entertaining. The main deck sits at the top, sheltered beneath an automatic awning, anchored by a built-in braai and pizza oven. Floating staircases add architectural drama as they descend toward the pool below, where a full-length martini seat and elongated waterfall feature set the scene for long afternoons with something cold in hand. A second deck pushes entertaining capacity to twenty guests without the space ever feeling stretched.

Inside, the master suite takes a different approach entirely. Dark walls finished in powder-washed cloudy plaster give the room a moody, enveloping quality.

The walk-through closet doubles as a personal gallery, with backlit smoked glass wardrobes displaying clothing as a considered collection. The en-suite bathroom earns the word spa without apology, anchored by a three-by-three-metre blue marble shower wall, dramatically downlit to draw out its deep veining.

The Slow Haus makes a compelling case.

Luxury was never really about size. It was always about how thoughtfully a space is imagined, and how completely it allows you to live.

# Maison Lumière

Vision: *Reimagining Home: A French Country Revival in Midstream*

When this Midstream Estate family came to us, the brief carried a particular kind of weight. They wanted a contemporary home where new memories could form without erasing the old ones. The house had history worth keeping. What it needed was refinement, and light.

The design vision centred on contemporary French Country, where rustic character meets understated elegance. The established gardens were never up for discussion. What changed was the home's relationship with its northern aspect. The existing layout shut out the sun almost entirely, leaving the interiors starved of natural light. The solution was a new covered patio with its roof slab elevated deliberately to draw in low winter sun while welcoming the longer summer light. This single move connected the living room, outdoor entertaining area, and pool into one fluid sequence, dissolving the boundary between inside and outside.

For the patio floor, the clients chose terrazzo. It was the right call. This composite of marble chips suspended in resin catches light differently as the day moves, and it's built to last generations. A quiet choice with a long story.

Inside, the transformation came through careful curation rather than structural change. Wide-format wood-grain tiles, updated lighting, and a freestanding cast iron fireplace anchored the living room with French Country character, while plantation shutters brought light control and timeless composure to the windows. The kitchen became the heart of the project. Blue shaker cabinets introduced a considered moment of colour against gold-veined sintered stone countertops. Satin brass knurled handles drew out the warmth in the stone veining, and illuminated timber display boxes completed a composition where every detail is considered, practical, and genuinely beautiful.

Maison Lumière is a reminder that the most meaningful work is often knowing what to keep and where to improve.

# Morningside Retreat

**Vision:** *Designing a retreat away from the corporate world that was minimalist, relaxed and did not feel like a hotel.*

There is a particular kind of exhaustion that comes with a demanding corporate life. Not just physical tiredness, but a deeper fatigue that accumulates when every environment you move through asks something of you. The brief was direct: design a retreat from the corporate world. Minimalist. Relaxed. And under no circumstances should it feel like a hotel.

The kitchen was where the transformation began. We demolished what existed and replaced it with an open island kitchen, generous and unhurried. The home's inner atrium was opened up in the process, connecting the kitchen directly to the living greenery of the courtyard beyond. The home now flows the way family life actually does.

The patio was enclosed in a frameless glazing system that disappears visually while doing considerable practical work. Maximum natural light during the day. Warmth and enclosure at night. The reinstated gas fireplace anchors the space with something no specification can fully capture: the particular slowness that a fire brings to a room on a cold Highveld evening.

Beach oak flows through the living areas and across every bedroom floor, its warmth underfoot setting the tone from the moment you wake. The new home office leans most heavily into this material language. In the kitchen, quartz waterfall islands pair with timber cabinetry in a combination that feels quietly luxurious without trying too hard.

Each of the four children's rooms was designed as a complete suite with a king size bed and the kind of finish that tells a child their room was taken seriously. The renovated master suite goes further, anchored by a walk-through closet that brings an unhurried luxury to the start and end of every day. White walls, clean lines, and surface-mounted downlights serve the ambience without demanding attention. Brass chandeliers above the dining table and kitchen island earn their place precisely because everything else exercises such restraint.

The Morningside Retreat doesn't perform. It creates the conditions for rest, for family, for the kind of evening that makes the demanding day feel worthwhile.

# Bo-Ho House

**Vision:** *Celebrate a Late Modernist home by bringing warmth, colour, and light into every space while honouring the character of the original architecture.*

Bo-Ho House began its life as a product of Late Modernist architecture. Raw structure expressed without apology. Materials left to speak for themselves. A high-tech design language that was bold, considered, and entirely of its time.

Decades later, the home needed a new chapter. The clients arrived with a brief that was equal parts ambitious and respectful: modernise the home, bring warmth, colour, and light into every space, and reinterpret the spirit of the original without diminishing it.

The laminated trusses were never going anywhere. They are the architectural signature of the home, the element that gives every room its character and scale. Rather than working around them, we leaned into them, preserving the originals throughout and introducing new I-beam trusses where the open plan layout demanded it. The ceiling became a feature. The structure became the decoration.

Natural light was among the most important items on the brief. The clients wanted more of it, everywhere, without sacrificing the steel-framed cottage pane doors and windows that gave the home its character. Colour and ambient lighting became the primary tools for reinterpreting the existing spaces. This was a deliberate choice rooted in a belief that design is never limited to lines on a sheet. Light, colour, scale, texture, material, and form are all available to the architect who is willing to think in three dimensions rather than two.

The work has since been recognised in SA Design and Decor, where the details that emerged from this balancing act between old and new were featured for exactly the quality that made them worth capturing.

Bo-Ho House stands as a reminder that the most meaningful renovations are not the ones that erase what came before. They are the ones that understand it well enough to carry it forward, transformed but intact, into whatever comes next.

# Flow House

**Vision:** *Modernise an existing family home by bringing natural timber and light into every space while enhancing the connection to the outdoors as often as possible.*



Some of the most interesting ones carry an inherent tension, and it is precisely that tension that produces the best work. The clients of Flow House, a South African German family in Bryanston, knew exactly what they loved: the African bushveld and the outdoors. They also knew what they needed: low maintenance, tiled surfaces, and cool colour temperatures. On paper, these two things pull in opposite directions. What this family was asking for required a different kind of thinking entirely.

Outside, the exterior palette was refined around soft browns and a rough-finished plaster texture that references the bushveld without imitating it. Rooftop gardens were rehabilitated, bringing living greenery back into the architecture. Old sliding doors were replaced with frameless stacking doors, transforming the relationship between inside and outside entirely. The pool, coping, and entertainment area were completely redone, and a timber deck now connects the pool to the main house, creating an enhanced atrium space that draws you through the property with a natural sense of flow.


The bathrooms delivered function and considerably more. Frameless showers, hexagonal marble flooring, and wood-look tiles on the floors softened the experience in a way that reads as warmth without behaving like timber. A considered solution that honours the brief while quietly exceeding it.

The main entrance is where the project announces itself most clearly. Original carpeting was removed to reveal the terrazzo staircase beneath, resurfaced and transformed from something overlooked into something celebrated. Dark cabinets paired with grey stone countertops carrying white veining brought an African sensibility into the space through material rather than decoration.

Cool in temperature yet Warm in character. Low in maintenance. High in everything that matters. Flow House is a home resolved in an unconventional manner.

# Rutland Guest House

Vision: *Contemporary executive self-catering suites rooted in the suburban character but with unmistakable African accents.*

There is a certain standard that the well-travelled executive carries with them. An expectation of quality shaped by the best hotels across the world, and a growing preference, above all of that, for something more personal. A space that feels considered, comfortable, and genuinely welcoming. The brief asked for contemporary executive self-catering suites rooted in the traditional suburban character of Rosebank.


Each suite was designed as a complete world. A dedicated writing desk and generous cupboard space speak to the practicalities of extended stays. A separate kitchenette behind a frosted glass barn door keeps the living space clean without sacrificing natural light. The bathrooms deliver on every expectation: walk-in showers backed by floor-to-ceiling marble set the tone for the entire suite.

The material palette does the rest. Engineered timber floors, quartz work surfaces, and an oak television wall panel layer warmth throughout. The headboard wall goes further – oak base, integrated uplighting, and floor-to-ceiling wallpaper creating a backdrop rich enough to make you want to linger. A large area rug anchors the room with quiet confidence. Matt black hardware ties it all together.

For the executive traveller tired of rooms that feel identical regardless of which city they are in, Rutland offers something genuinely different: a space that knows where it belongs, designed for someone who deserves better than ordinary.

# Azure Horizon

**Vision:** *Design a Beach Front Holiday home that embraces the luxurious and minimalist mediterranean aesthetic while embracing natural materials, open courtyards and natural light.*

Some places ask to be met with intention. The shores of Lake Malawi are among them. Where the water stretches toward a horizon that feels borrowed from the Mediterranean, where light falls differently and life slows to something more present, more real. When the family acquired their beachfront plot here, they didn't simply want a holiday home. They wanted a place that could hold an entire extended family across generations, nurture spiritual connection, and carry meaning that outlasts any single visit.

The concept is rooted in three ideas: the courtyard, the threshold, and the view. Three courtyards – front, centre, and rear – give the home its breath and rhythm, drawing light and air through the plan while creating moments of stillness at different hours of the day. Every threshold is treated as an opportunity rather than a boundary, and every principal room faces the lake, because a home on this shore should never forget where it is.

Outside, the property unfolds toward the water with purpose. A sunken lounge uses the natural slope of the site to create a sheltered gathering space with a fire pit and uninterrupted views. A shared boathouse for the three brothers sits at the shoreline, with provision for a jetty that makes every departure to the water feel like the beginning of something good.

Azure Horizon is designed for the long view. Not just the one across the lake, but the longer view of a family returning here year after year, to the place that holds them best.

# Courtyard Residence

Vision: *Designing a retreat away from the corporate world that was minimalist, relaxed and did not feel like a hotel.*

The best homes are organised around a single idea. One concept that every room, every threshold, and every view either serves or celebrates. For this Sandton residence, that idea is the courtyard. And everything flows from it. We were appointed to re-envision an existing family home with good bones, an established garden, and a pond worth keeping. The brief asked for a contemporary architectural language rooted in pitched roofs, exposed trusses, and a deeply considered relationship between inside and outside. The courtyard became the concept that made all of it cohere.


Think of it less as an outdoor space and more as the heart of the home. Every principal room orients toward it. Open to sky, softened with landscaping and water features, it is simultaneously the social centre of the house and its breathing room.

The kitchen was expanded and opened into an integrated dining space beneath a double-volume pitched roof with exposed trusses and skylights, creating a room that is generous, light-filled, and directly connected to the courtyard. The entrance was reimagined as a covered architectural threshold that draws you naturally toward the courtyard and the life of the home beyond it.

# Charles Residence

Vision: *A private residence designed with the precision of a boutique hotel and the warmth of a family home.*

The brief for this Bryanston residence arrived with a single, clear ambition: a home that lives like a five-star retreat. Unhurried, refined, and completely private. Our response was a 650m<sup>2</sup> double-storey family home built around the tension between grandeur and calm. High ceilings and frameless glazing dissolve the boundary between inside and out, flooding the interior with the kind of light that makes a room feel considered even when nothing is happening in it.

The architectural language is uncompromisingly contemporary. Clean horizontal lines, expressed soffits, and a material palette of stone, timber, and glass that reads as quiet luxury rather than statement architecture. The rear of the home opens entirely onto a sculpted pool terrace designed for both active family life and the kind of slow Sunday afternoon that needs no agenda.

Inside, the living spaces are generous without being excessive. Double volume, and detailed with the restraint of a home that trusts good proportion over decoration. An eight car garage and dedicated staff living quarters for four ensure the household runs invisibly, so that the people who live here never have to think about anything other than living well.
